I hope this letter finds you well. As usual, it has been a busy and exciting week of new learning experiences at WBP!



Firstly, I am thrilled to report that our whole school Parent Reading Morning, held yesterday was a great success. It was wonderful to see so many of you in attendance, engaging with your children and their love for reading. For our KS2 students, it was also an excellent opportunity to introduce and explore the Reading Plus platform together. We encourage you to continue supporting your child's reading journey by using this platform both at home and in school.

In other news, our Year 3 students had an enriching experience this week with their trip to the Science Museum. This visit enhanced their understanding of our current science topic, 'Light,' and provided them with hands-on learning opportunities outside the classroom. The children also used a range of experimental technology in their class assembly last week when sharing their spring term learning which was exciting to see.





Meanwhile, in Year 5, our budding artists have been honing their drawing skills, drawing inspiration from the renowned artist Henry Moore's hand drawings. We are incredibly impressed by the outcomes our students have achieved and their keen attention to detail in capturing tone and form.

Excitingly, children in Year 1, 4, and 5 had the chance to trial a dynamic new maths app called Magma Maths. This innovative tool allows students to use their iPads to record their working and calculations, with their progress being tracked and recorded by their class teacher. Additionally, they can playback their working to evaluate their reasoning and calculation skills, making learning maths even more interactive and engaging.



Lastly, I would like to commend our fantastic Playleaders for leading a whole school assembly this week alongside Miss White. They did an outstanding job of explaining their roles and sharing strategies for promoting positive playtimes. It's wonderful to see our students taking ownership of creating a welcoming and inclusive environment during break times.




In year 4, we have begun our new topic looking at the Islamic civilisation. We began with exploring the Arabic alphabet and had a go at writing our own names.

In year 5 science, we have been investigating the properties of materials. We tested a variety of materials to see if they were conductors, magnetic, absorbent, rigid, or flexible.



Update on Behaviour at WBP

We are pleased to share that the number of behaviour incidents at Willow Bank Primary School are decreasing. This is due to the range of strategies implemented by our Behaviour Mentor and staff to support the children. Some children benefit from having an individual behaviour plan, which provides targets that are adapted to the child's needs. Credit sheets are also a tool used to give children a visual reminder of the behaviours they need to implement, and we have a good success rate of children who have previously used them.

We are also very fortunate to have Playleaders in place who support every lunchtime, on the playground, lunch hall and communal areas to ensure a smooth, safe, and enjoyable playtime experience.

We understand that not all children enjoy unstructured times of the day such as play and lunch time, Miss White provides a fantastic provision in the inclusion hub every day where children can have fun playing ping pong, colouring, iPad time, board games and even watch a movie on Fridays.

We at Willow Bank are proud of all our students and the continued progress they make in all areas.
