This week Magnolia have been learning all about Japan! We have looked at where Japan is in the world, what seasons they have, and what food they eat and traditions. The children have enjoyed packing for Japan, creating art for the seasons and creating their own fans for fan dancing.










IThis term in Year 1, the children have been working towards answering the big question of 'How has transport changed?' The children have been looking at different modes of transport and identifying how they have differed from then to now. They have also been exploring influential figures such as George Stephenson and the Wright Brothers.







In History, Year 2 have been learning about the Battle of Hastings, how castles were built and how they developed over time. We have also been looking at the features of castles and who lived in them. In groups, we worked together to order the events that led up to the Battle of Hastings and here is an example of labelling a Motte and Bailey castle





Motte-a mound forming the site of a castle or camp.



In geography, we have been examining the country of Spain. We have identified that Spain has 17 different regions and each region has its own capital city. We have also looked at its climate and how it differs from the climate of the UK. When looking at this, we could see why the climate of Spain is hotter than that of the UK and we started to understand why Spain is a popular holiday destination










Year 4 recently embarked on an engaging journey through geography, where they explored the concepts of essential and non-essential items. They learned about the vital importance of essentials such as shelter, water, and food in sustaining human life. Through various activities and discussions, they developed a deep understanding of why these necessities were critical for

survival.





This term, children in year5 are exploring the fascinating history of the Benin Kingdom. They are learning about the kingdom's rich timeline, its vibrant civilization, located in West Africa, the Benin Kingdom is renowned for its rich culture, advanced society, and impressive art. Children discovered how the kingdom was ruled by powerful Obas (kings) and are exploring the everyday lives of its people. This exploration will give them a deeper understanding of Benin's cultural heritage and historical significance.







In Year 6, students dived into the world of production and theatre by exploring the classic musical "Bugsy Malone" as part of their end of year production. This engaging historical view of early 20th century has allowed students to learn about the different aspects of theatre production, including acting, set design, costume creation and behind-the-scenes technical work.
