This week in Reception Magnolia Class, we explored Understanding the World through our very own **Kindness Garden**. The children learned that just like plants need sun, water, and care to grow, kindness also needs nurturing. Together, we talked about small acts of kindness—helping a friend, using gentle hands, sharing, and saying kind words—and how these can help our classroom "garden" flourish. The children then added their own "kindness seeds" to the garden by drawing or writing something kind they had done or planned to do. It was wonderful to see them reflect on how their actions can make others feel happy, safe, and valued, and the Kindness Garden has already begun to bloom with their thoughtful ideas.









Year 2 have been developing their geographical knowledge by learning about the four countries of the United Kingdom: England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. The children have explored each country's capital city, key landmarks and special features, Alongside this, the class have been investigating the difference between rural and urban environments.










Year 1 have been learning about the 4 countries of the UK, we have found them on maps and labelled them: England, Northern Oreland, Scotland and Wales!

Year 3 also loved their visit to Erith Fire Station, where they met firefighters, explored the station, and discovered the teamwork and bravery behind their work.







This week in History, children explored Ancient Egypt, learning about its culture, treasures, and remarkable achievements. They especially enjoyed discovering how Howard Carter uncovered Tutankhamun's tomb, sparking curiosity and excitement about archaeology and the mysteries of the ancient world today.






