## Year 2 – Farm to Fork

Should we import from overseas?

Through this big question year 2 have learnt about different types of farms we have in the UK and how they are used, including finding out when different foods and vegetables are planted and harvested. We also have learnt how far food travels and investigated pros and cons for importing food from overseas.

Our writing outcome was writing instructions on how to make a delicious honey cake. We were very proud of our instruction writing and how the cakes turned out!







Last term, Year 1 explored the topic, 'Life On Planet Earth.' The children read the book Molly Mcdrew Around the World to help them write their own adventure story using their skills from their incidental poem help them to describe their destination. In art, the children researched the artist Paul Klee and recreated their own style of their continuous drawing both digitally and on paper using a range of media.



Year 3

Last term in year 3, our topic was all about how our House Champions changed the world. To discover how they changed the world, we needed to identify the inequalities which they all faced throughout their lives. We noticed that they all had a reoccurring theme, they were all treated differently based on their characteristics. As a class, we discussed that everyone should be treated equally regardless of their characteristics.

In writing, we were looking at The Iron Man. To help us with our end piece, we wrote a character description describing the Iron Man and his appearance. After we knew what he looked like, wen wrote our outcome, a narrative recount on the night which we first saw him standing on the cliff.
