

This term they came into school to find some strange items that have appeared in their classrooms. The children had to put their thinking caps on and investigate what the items were and who they belonged to soon to discover they belonged to the main character of their new core text for this term. They dived deep into their new topic of Romans by researching and acting out scenes that would have taken place in ancient Rome!









As part of our History hook lesson in Year 4, children conducted research on the history of the Vikings, including information on their background, accomplishments, and significant artefacts. As a creative activity , they skillfully crafted their own Viking shields using cardboard, embellishing them with distinct painted artwork to symbolise the Viking warriors.
