Magnolia have settled in very well this week. We've had lots of fun making new friends and getting to know each other. It's been a wonderful start, full of smiles, play, and new experiences!






Year 1 received an exciting letter and parcels in the post. When we opened the parcels we found clues and used our previous knowledge about fairy tales to guess who the parcels were from. We then read different fairy tales and discussed our favourite characters.





Year 2 have been busy unleashing their imaginations by creating their very own monsters! From spiky tails to googly eyes and glittery wings, no two creatures were the same. The children enjoyed designing, describing, and sharing their creations.





Children in year3 took part in a hook lesson that transported them back to the Stone Age to explore how people lived differently compared to today. Working in small groups in the forest area, they completed survival challenges. They built simple shelters using sticks, leaves, and natural materials, thinking about how Stone Age people stayed safe and warm. They also created cave art with charcoal, chalk on brown paper, drawing animals, handprints, or hunting scenes like Stone Age artists.







In our Writing hook lesson, children became reporters and interviewees, exploring the real-life sighting of whales in the River Thames. Using videos, podcasts, and news articles, they investigated, discussed, and reported on what this surprising event could have meant.





In Year 5, we launched our new history topic with a creative hook lesson. Children designed and made traditional Benin-inspired bracelets or necklaces, using vibrant colours and patterns to explore the rich culture and craftsmanship of the Benin Kingdom.






In year 6 this week we explored costumes and items that belong to the three main characters from The Highwayman and made inferences about their role in the story.

♠ Parent & Carer Alert: The "Salt & Ice Challenge"

A dangerous online trend is resurfacing where children put salt on their skin and press ice on top.

- This causes serious cold burns (like frostbite).
- f Injuries can need hospital treatment and even skin grafts.
- ← Young people may not realise the damage until it's too late.
- First Aid: Cool with lukewarm running water for 10+ minutes, cover with clean cling film, and seek medical help. X Do NOT use ice, creams, or fluffy dressings.
