













Our RE question this half term has been -What does it mean to belong to a faith community? We have been learning about similarities between religions and how different ceremonies are celebrated.









In RE we have been looking at the question – Who is Muslim and what do they believe? We have been learning about the features of a Mosque

and the Islamic creation story.













This half term in RE we have been thinking about the question – What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain today?
We have been identifying features of a church and discussing how churches can help communities.









We have been learning about the teachings of Jesus and why he is important to people.








In RE this half term, we have been focusing on the question – Why do Mosques matter to the Muslim community? We have been learning and explaining why Mosques are important within the Islamic faith.
