

Computing at WBP

Reception have used a creative game to practice counting in twos whilst also learning about money! We learned about the following coins and their value: 1p, 2p, 5p and 10p. We also explored the difference between pence and pounds.





Last term in Year 1, we worked on exploring Showbie further. We created all sorts of pieces of work including narrating the book "Here We Are" as well as labelling the continents of the Earth. We also had a sneak peek at computing using robots using the Sphero's to explore uses of iPads!



Year 2 explored many ways that technology is used in the world around us. They also wrote rules about the world around us. We then had a look at Sphero's to get familiar with the devices ahead of using them in Year 3 and Year 4.







Year 3 have been using the Swift Playgrounds app to learn the basics of coding. Year 3 have been learning to use functions such as loops and commands as well as learning about Fake News as part of their elearning. Year 3 have loved using this programme and can't wait to try again next year.

Year 4 have been using the Swift Playgrounds app to learn how to code. Each child has a playground character named Byte who must collect gems as he moves around the app. The children problem solve and work collaboratively when they have developed an error in their code. They need to fix the code for their character Byte to progress further. Year 4 have shown real enthusiasm in computing.


"We like that you can give commands to the robot on the iPad, and it will do the command unless you have made a mistake in the code" - Isaiah & Tobi.

"The thing I like about the programme is when you have made a mistake on the code, it gives you a hint so that I can fix my code and move my character." - Rachael.







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

"My app is about shopping for cakes and ordering them." - Abdullahi






