


WBP Art and Diversity Fortnight Monday 24th June – Friday 5th July 2024






This week Magnolia have opened their maths shed and have been revisiting their learning from the year. They have enjoyed writing and ordering numbers, discussing shapes and using the weighing scales.



In year 1 we have been exploring numbers up to 100. We used our knowledge of tens and ones to help us identify and organise these numbers. For our maths hook lesson, we played bingo with numbers up to 100. In the coming lessons, we will be looking at identifying numbers one more and one less up to 100, using the skills we developed when working with numbers up to 50.





In Year 2 we have been learning about addition and subtraction. We solved calculations using number lines and 100 squares.

In Year 3, we have been learning about geometric shapes. In this topic, we have been looking at both 2-D and 3-D shapes. Whilst looking at both 2-D and 3-D shapes, we have identified what makes a shape either 2-D or 3-D.

'I know that a 2-D shape with all four sides the same length is a square, whilst a 3-D shape with all four sides being the same length is called a cube' - Adam.














Year 4 have been studying the topic of position and direction. We have focused on co-ordinates this week; discovered how we can identify the coordinates on a graph and plotted our own coordinates using the x- axis and y-axis. we have also begun to reason using justification to prove our answers.




Year 6
