




Geography for all at Willow Bank Primary school

Me, My Family and My Home

Reception have been learning about themselves and understanding the importance of family relationships. The core text which the children learned about was pivotal to knowing that we are all different yet the same. Stories were shared about the book characters and also about people who are important to them. They enjoyed this aspect of their learning which really helped to settle them into their learning journey at Willow Bank.





The World is your Oyster!

Year 1

This term Year 1 explored Planet Earth. We have learned the names and locations of the 7 continents and the 5 oceans. Continuing this discovery, we learned about the Equator and how it splits the earth into two main parts: the Northern Hemisphere and Southern Hemisphere. Later we discovered how the planet is hotter and colder in some places, and what sort of animals might live there.

Oh, I do like to be beside the seaside...

Our big question this term is what makes beaches special. We have been looking at human and physical features of the seaside. The children have asked lots of questions and used their own experience of the seaside to recall physical features such as: pebbles, sand and water.

We have also researched about how sand is created and the difference between high and low tides. We are looking forward to exploring human features of the beach such as: piers, ice cream vans and fish and chip shops.

Disaster Strikes!

In the summer term, the children have been learning about the layers of the Earth and how continents sit on plates. They researched about how these plates move, cause friction and how this leads to the creation of volcanoes. Through our reading text 'Earth Shattering Events' the children have been exploring volcanoes, earthquakes, tsunamis, and other natural disasters. The children will then create their own newspaper article based on what they have learnt.

What's Going On?

Year 4 have been learning about climate and weather around the world, as well as the different types of vegetation in each climate zone. They have been looking at the main oceans and the impact of the Gulf Stream on the UK's climate. Our children have found learning about the effect of greenhouse gases on climate change very interesting and they have really enjoyed debating the issues which are caused by human activity. Some of the work, has given our children 'food for thought' and they have started to formulate their own questions about how we live and how this may change in the future.

Lest We Forget

This term our Geography topic will focus on the question **'Should we Unite to Fight?**'

In this topic we will continue our learning of WWII and will focus on the Allied forces – predominantly the soldiers from the British Empire.

We will explore how their contributions led to the dismantling of the British Empire and their independence.

Children will be looking at primary and secondary sources to aid in research understanding of the global effects of WWII such as Windrush and the formation of Pakistan and Bangladesh.

<u>Make a Difference</u>

Our Big Question last half term was '**How can we make a difference in society?**' We looked at the work conservationists were doing around the world and why they were needed. We then researched endangered species and discussed reasons why they were at risk, discovering human threats, including the destruction of habitats and poaching. After that, we identified where those habitats are on a map.


