## Spotlight on Learning with Our School Ambassadors

This week, our School Ambassadors have been hard at work visiting lessons across the school to speak with children about their learning experiences. Their focus this week was on core subjects, including science.

## Year 6 Science:

In Year 6, children have been learning about electric circuits. They explored what happens to a lightbulb when an additional cell is added to a circuit. The ambassadors were impressed by how children recorded their findings in their science books and how confidently they explained their learning using scientific vocabulary.



## Year 5 Science:



In Year 5, the focus was on our Solar System. Children were learning about the Earth's orbit around the Sun, the Moon's orbit around the Earth, and how these movements affect night, day, and the seasons. One Year 5 student enthusiastically shared, "I love science because right now we are learning about heliocentric and geocentric models. One full spin takes 24 hours, and it's so interesting to prove why heliocentric is the real order of the Solar System!"

The ambassadors used their iPads to take photos of the learning environment, capture learning in books, and record interviews with children. These will form part of a growing evidence bank on our Showbie learning platform, which helps teachers and subject leaders review and celebrate the fantastic learning taking place across the school.

We are excited to announce a friendly football match with St Michael's C of E School at the end of the month. Children across KS2 have been chosen to participate in this game, which will take place at Willow Bank during the school day. This week, we have had so much fun reading the story The Enormous Turnip! We have been exploring lots of dlious fruits and vegetables, learning all about their shapes and colours. In phonics, we've been working hard to break up big words into smaller chunks – it's like a word puzzle! In maths, we've been discovering how numbers are made up of smaller parts – it's so interesting! What an exciting week we've had!





In Year 2, students explored the concept of money by using hands-on manipulatives to calculate change. Through role-play and practical activities, they handle coins and notes to solve real-life problems, such as buying items and determining the correct change.









This week in Year 1, the children have been exploring the concept of finding "1 more" and "1 less." Using number lines, practical activities, and fun games, they have been practising adding one to a number and taking one away. This has helped them develop their number sense and confidence with counting forwards and backwards.





In Year 3, we have just started our new topic of length and perimeter. We have started by looking at the different unit of measurements, metres, centimetres and millimetres. To ensure accuracy when measuring, we have been utilising our iPads to zoom in on pictures, as well as using rulers to help us when drawing our lines.



Through hands-on activities and problem-solving challenges, they are building confidence in applying these skills to real-world situations.








Year 6






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## **KS1 & EYFS Parent Reading Morning**
