This term Reception have been working on writing their 'I am...' sentences. We have practised by first learning our sounds and then how to form our letters. We have begun to sound out words using the sounds we know and have written sentences to match our portraits.





Year 1 have been writing letters from the Big Bad Wolf, apologising for his actions. We also explored how he did not show kindness and respect, linking his behaviour to our school values. We have focused on writing simple sentences, using finger spaces and full stops!





Year 2 pupils created their own adventure stories, filled with unique characters, thrilling settings and exciting plots. They learned to plan a clear beginning, middle and end to their stories while using expanded noun phrases, adjectives and descriptive language.






Year 3 students have created their own portal narratives, focusing on travelling back in time and living like a Stone Age child. Children have been focusing on incorporating expanded noun phrases, onomatopoeia and prepositional language in their narratives.







Year 4 sailed into creativity, inspired by "This Morning I Met a Whale." They penned enchanting diary entries, capturing moments from a whale encounter to save the world.






This term, Year 5 children explored Children of the Benin Kingdom by Dinah Orji, an adventurous story set in the historic Benin Empire. Drawing inspiration from the book, they wrote their own narratives based on its characters and chapters for their final outcome. As part of their incidental writing, they also crafted fufu recipes, linking to the story's themes of tradition.





Year 6 have been writing their own newspaper reports based on Alfred Noyes' The Highway Man. The Children have put themselves in the position of journalists, writing in the third person and using skills such as direct and indirect speech.
