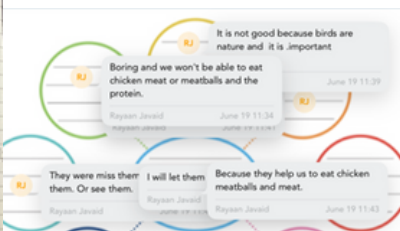
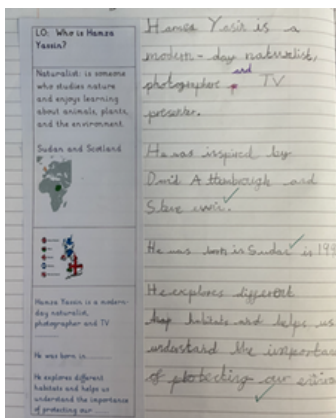
Year 1

This half term, Year 4 have not held a humanities topic.

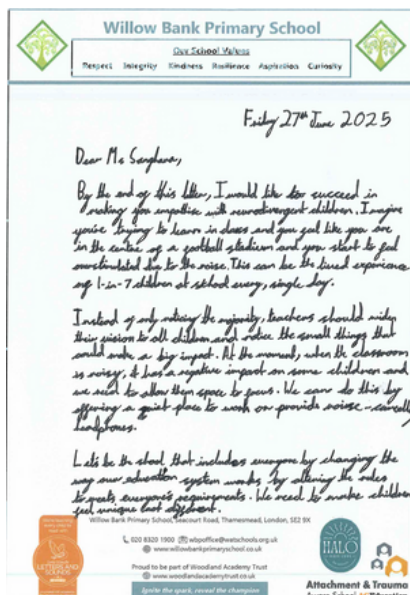
Year 5

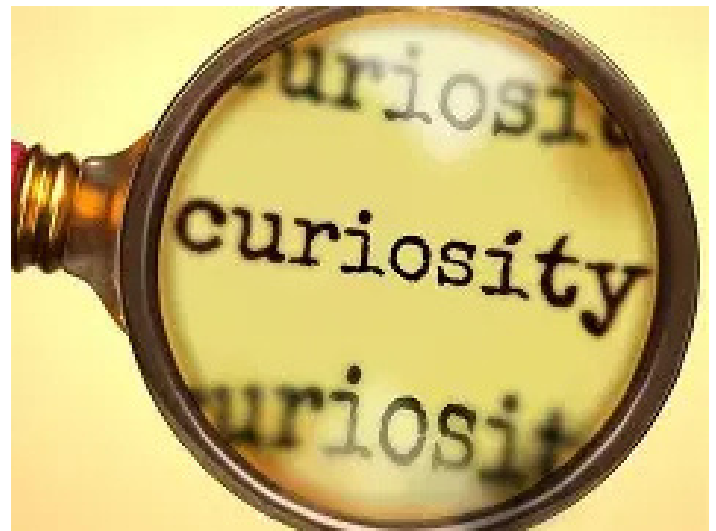


Year 6
